

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree awarded
- First pharmacy school based in the Fort Worth-Dallas Metroplex
- Class size of 100 students
- Three years of didactic courses and introductory pharmacy practice experiences
- One year of advanced pharmacy practice experience

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS – ALL APPLICANTS MUST:

- Be U.S. citizens or U.S. permanent residents
- Have completed the pre-pharmacy prerequisites (minimum of 71 credit hours) prior to matriculation. Students may take prerequisites at UNT, UNT Dallas or other universities and two/four year colleges.
- Achieve a minimum 2.50 grade point average on all completed coursework
- Obtain three (3) letters of recommendation
- Complete the Pharmacy College Admissions Test (PCAT)
- Must have a minimum of 40 composite percentile to apply.

TIMELINES

- Accreditation process ongoing
- July 2014 – PharmCAS and UNT System College of Pharmacy supplemental applications go live
- September - January interviews (Rolling Admission)
- August 10-12, 2014 – Orientation Week
- August 15, 2014 – White Coat Ceremony
- August 17, 2014 – Classes begin

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

APPLY

Submit an online application through the PharmCAS: www.pharmcas.org/ and submit a supplemental application with a non-refundable application processing fee of \$75.00.

INTERVIEW

Office of Admissions staff will review all applicant information and invite prospective applicants to interview for the PharmD program. Note that not all applicants will be invited to interview.

DECISION

Admissions Committee will review the entire applicant file and make a decision on the applicant's entry into the PharmD program.
